- Have a 3 min

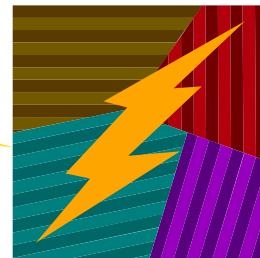
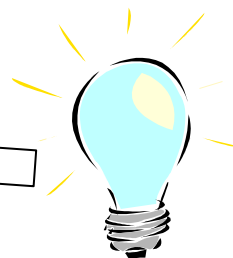


The Sun Shines on the Solar Panels
